# Roadway Projects Completed 2025

---

**Road Program** - approximately 4 miles were repaved.

---

**Reclamite Treatment** - This roadway treatment bidding/contracting was part of the McHenry County Municipal Partnering Initiative. Approximately 8 lane miles were treated.

---

**Roadway Striping** – We were able to do 44.5 lane miles of striping. This includes white and yellow lines.

---

**Crack Seal Treatment** – We were able to treat Ringwood Road from Johnsborg Road to Broadway Street. This work was also bid as part of the McHenry County Municipal Partnering Initiative.

## Roadway Projects Proposed 2026

- **CDBG Grant** – We applied for a grant to complete Dubell Park Subdivision. Assuming this is approved, we will utilize these funds to reconstruct Sydenham St, Britton Dr, Croydon St, Nippersink Dr, North St, Grant Place, South Ave and East St.
- **Road Program** – Roads currently included in the program are Alton Rd, Woodland Dr, Highland Dr, Hillside Dr, and Beachside Dr, located in the West Shore Beach Subdivision. Spojnia Rd, Beach Ave, Pulaski Rd, MacArthur Dr, Freedom Dr, and Kosciusko Rd located in the Polish Camp Subdivision. Other roads included are Flanders Rd (only McHenry Township portions), Trey Rd, Tecumseh Rd, Seattle Ct, and Old Draper Rd. The project has been bid, and Geske & Sons was the lowest bidder at \$918,871.08. Contract documents are complete, and paving is scheduled for late summer or early fall.
- **Reclamite Treatment** will be the first treatment for Howard, Gregory, William, Jeffery, Roger, Florence, West Street, Althoff, Edgewood Drive, and Finch Trail. This will be the second treatment for Annabelle St, Sunset Dr, Hickory Grove, Fawn Lane, Hickory Trail, Church Street, Circle Trail, Fawn Grove, Riverside Dr and Howe Rd. The Village of Winnetka went out for bid in early February 2024, with Corrective Asphalt Materials being the sole bidder. We have a third-year option for 2026 at \$1.24 per square yard. We are planning on doing 107,994 SY for \$133,912.56
- **Roadway Striping** – We have contracted our paint striping for 2026 to Countryman Inc. We have executed an agreement with them for just under \$30,000.00. This will cover all of our roads that require striping.
- **Crack Seal Treatment** – The City of Crystal Lake is going out for bid this year. We have requested 25,000 lbs, which we estimate will cost \$50,000. Roads to be done are as follows. Woodrow Dr, Emerald Dr, Shorewood Dr, located in Indian Ridge Subdivision in Wonder Lake, Elmkirk Park, Regner Rd, Magellan Dr and Wooded Lane.

# Storm Water Management Program

## National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)

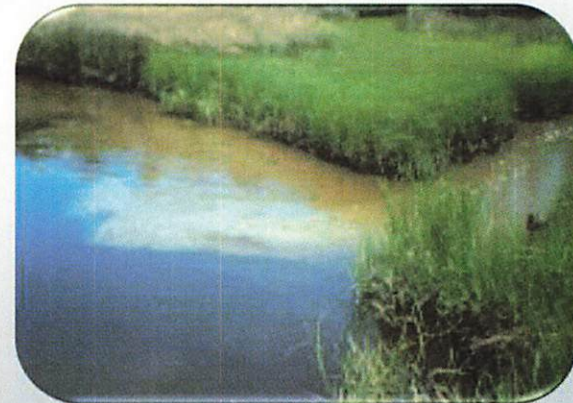
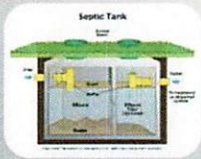
McHenry Township Road District maintains stormwater systems along its roads and highway by managing the quality and quantity of stormwater discharge in compliance with NPDES regulations. Following all essential procedures and requirements, the Road District is working to preserve, protect, and improve McHenry Township waters by sweeping roadways, cleaning catch basins, picking up roadside trash, and inspecting drains twice a year.



As stormwater flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants. The polluted water flows through a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream, river, wetland, or coastal water. This drainage discharges untreated into the water bodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. Homeowners can do their part in protecting our waters by doing the following.



- Recycle used oil and other automotive fluids at participating service stations
- Properly dispose of excess paints through a hazardous waste collection program
- Drain your swimming pool only when a test kit does not detect chlorine levels
- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly
- Have your septic system inspected by a professional at least every 3 years, and the septic tank pumped every 3 to 5 years

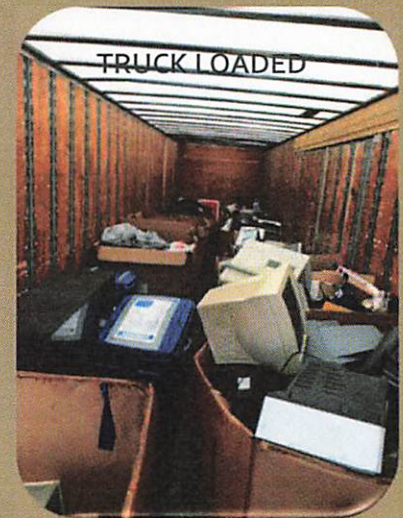
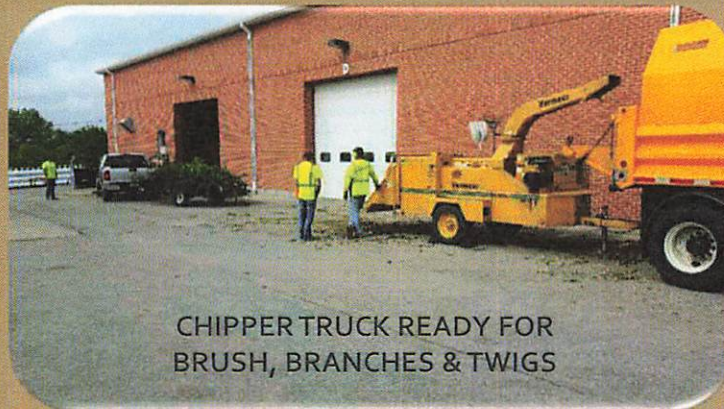
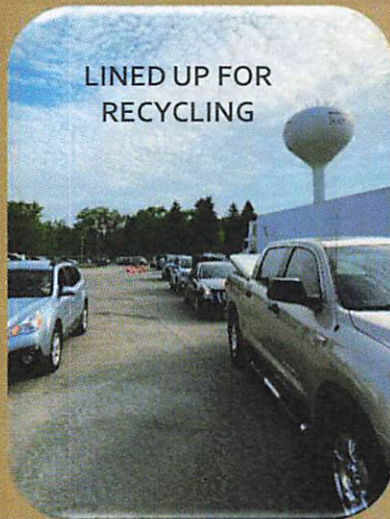
